## WHAT ARE THEME GROUPS?

Theme Groups bring together the key service providers and service users for a particular theme. Theme Groups form one element of the [Hambleton Strategic Partnership](#).

There are five Theme Groups operating in Hambleton, each covering different subject areas. They are:

- **PROSPEROUS** – Business, Tourism, Training, Skills, Agriculture, Transport and Market Towns
- **PEOPLE** – Access to Services & Information, Community Development, Older People and Young People
- **PLACES** – Environment, Housing, Waste Reduction, Recycling, Climate Change, Renewable Energy and Biodiversity
- **SAFE** – Fear of Crime, Road Safety, Autocrime, Anti-Social Behaviour and Alcohol & Drugs
- **HEALTHY** – Healthcare, Culture, Leisure & Sport and Improving Health & Well Being.

The role of each Theme Group is to:

- To find out the [views and aspirations](#) of the local community through consultation and involvement
- Collate this information in the Community Plan and develop a Theme Group action plan of projects that [address the issues](#) identified by the community



- [Work in partnership](#) to deliver projects, including working with other Theme Groups and Area Groups where appropriate
- [Monitor progress](#) against delivery of projects; review the action plans and report back to the Executive Group, Partnership Board and wider community. Theme Groups are independently chaired and meet on a regular basis.
