

# NEW RECYCLING SCHEME FOR HAMBLETON NEXT MONTH

Last year almost 44% of Hambleton's household waste was recycled through green bins and recycling facilities across the district.

From next month - in order to increase that yet more - a kerbside recycling scheme will begin. Over the next few weeks each household will receive a blue bag and a blue box. The bag is for paper and the box for cans, glass and plastic bottles. Additional boxes can be provided depending on individual household needs.

Collections for the majority of households will start on November 19 with 50% of the district getting recyclables collected on green bin week and the other half on black bin week. It is

hoped to keep collections on the same day as the wheeled bin days.

However only those households that receive a calendar with the box and bag delivery will receive the new service from November. A small minority will not be included in the service until a later date.

This new scheme replaces the existing blue bag paper collection scheme run by Yorwaste so householders must follow the new collection calendar.

Boxes and bags must be placed at the edge of properties or at the designated collection point from 7.30am.

If you live in a flat alternative arrangements may be made. Individual circumstances will also be looked at.

### Blue Box



- Glass bottles and jars
- Plastic bottles only
- Food and drink cans
- Tins and aerosols
- Pet food cans/tins
- Biscuit tins



- Broken glass
- Pyrex
- Window and mirror glass
- Glass milk bottles
- Light bulbs
- Drinking glasses
- Foil and paint cans
- Trays of any sort
- Yoghurt pots or tubs

### Blue Bag



- Newspapers and magazines
- Paper and brochures
- Leaflets and junk mail
- Office paper
- Catalogues
- Junk mail and non-window envelopes
- Shredded paper
- Wrapping paper



- Cardboard
- Yellow Pages
- Telephone Directories
- Birthday Cards
- Plastic wrappers
- Paper-based drinks cartons
- Window envelopes
- Cardboard of any type

- Please rinse containers and bottles and remove tops.
- Labels can be left on.
- Any contaminated boxes and bags will be left with a label saying why the recyclables are contaminated.
- Try to keep your materials separate in the box so we can recycle safely and quickly.
- Do not include any plastic bags.
